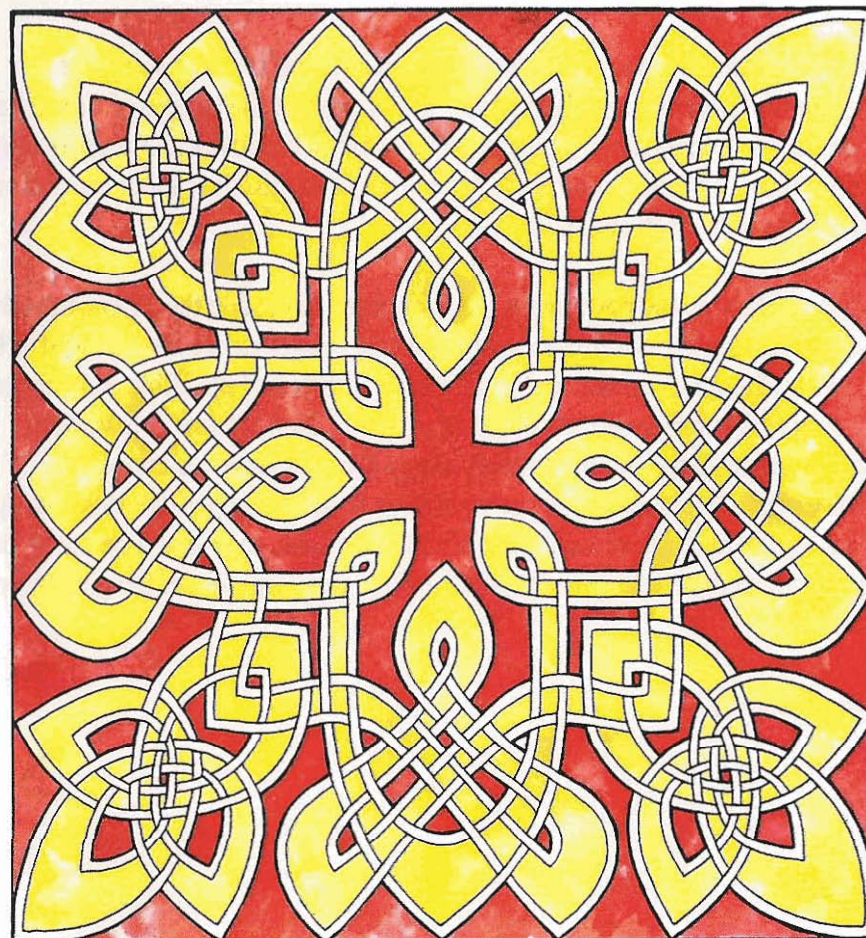

From The Vicar June 2017

We begin this month with what has become known as the Church's Birthday – the Feast of Pentecost, or Whitsunday (in old language!) The image on the cover is a Celtic representation of the flames of Pentecost.

On this day we remember that world-changing morning long ago in Jerusalem when the disciples were gathered in prayer “and suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind. . . and there appeared to them tongues as of fire.” (Acts 2:2). We end the month with a Deanery Service at Wassand Hall, acting as a reminder that we do not exist in isolation, but are part of something bigger. Indeed the Deanery of North Holderness is exploring how we might do things together even better than we already do!

Pentecost ends the season of Easter and we look forward to 20 or so weeks of Ordinary Time. There is nothing ordinary about this but the season of Trinity has often been referred to as the growing season probably because the liturgical colour is green! So it is an opportunity for us to grow in faith, to discover more about God and his relationship with each one of us.

One of the delights of the past month has been to be alongside the 11 candidates who have been preparing for confirmation at Pentecost. Together we have looked at the church's year, the services, the creeds as well as prayer and the Bible. It is impossible to cover everything for we are all works in progress. Nonetheless, I have been reminded throughout that there are many things that we think we know and understand, or that we do because we've always done so. So perhaps this Trinity season we should take time to ask the difficult questions, to re-examine our priorities and to allow ourselves to be sent into the world to proclaim afresh the good news of Jesus Christ.

The Sparrowhawk its now the second most common raptor since the pesticide crisis in the 1950 and 1960, thankfully DTD is not used now. It's a small/ medium sized & has a long tail, short wings, finely barred under parts and as a furious expression. Sometimes it will sit on your garden fence.

Witnessing a sparrowhawk taking song birds from your bird table can be upsetting, but its very clear that the small birds are thriving and doing enough to support predators which would not be there unless there was an adequate number of prey. Predator abundance is controlled by them, they need to hunt in order to live. The numbers will rise only if prey number are rising, most song birds produce chicks in double figures, and on average only one chick per year needs to survive to maintain the population.

All in the month of June

It was:

100 years ago: on 4th June 1917 that the Order of the British Empire was established by King George V.

80 years ago: on 30th June 1937 that the 999 emergency telephone service went into operation in London. It was the first such service in the world.

75 years ago: on 12th June 1942 that Anne Frank received her famous diary for her 13th birthday. She used it to document her life over the next two years as her family hid from the Nazis.

Also 75 years ago: on 25th June 1942 that The Daily Telegraph newspaper published the first account of the mass murder of Polish Jews. It reported that Germany had murdered 700,000 already, and that a further 1000 a day were being killed in gas chambers at Auschwitz. It was reported to be 'the greatest massacre in history' yet the story was largely ignored; it only made page 5 of the newspaper, and the other newspapers did not even run it.

50 years ago: on 1st June 1967 the album Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band was released by the Beatles.

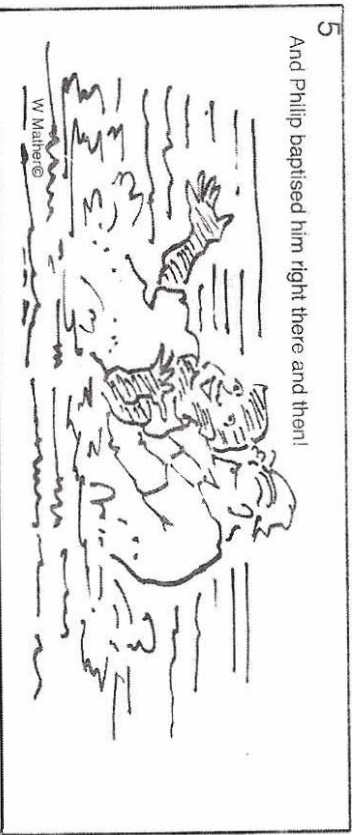
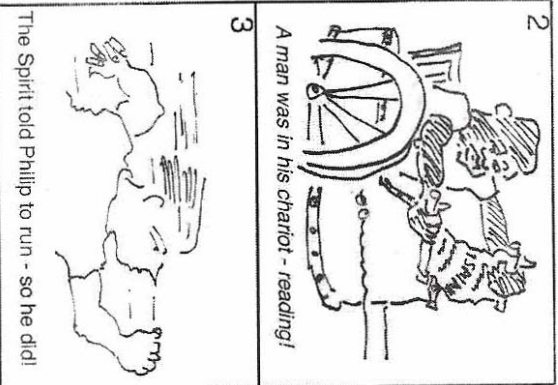
10 years ago: on 29th June 2007 that Apple released the first iPhone.
