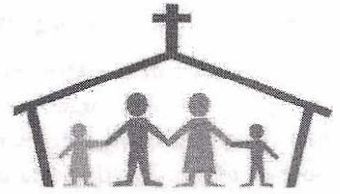

Kanzashi Brooch Making at the September meeting of Aldbrough WI.

17 ladies met in the Methodist Chapel School room on 2nd September.

Margaret Brooker demonstrated the art of making a Kanzashi Brooch. The members then went on to make their own brooches using circles of cotton material, sewn and drawn up into petals, stitched in place using strong linen bound cotton. Backing was applied and a large button was used to act as the centre of the flower. One of the important aspects of making the brooches was not to cut the thread until sewing complete.

An array of very pretty flower brooches was made.

The President then went onto hold the business meeting. Members were reminded that the Aldbrough WI were in the final of the Federation quiz to be held in Beverley on September 24th.
