*From the Vicar August 2014*

This time of year is always busy with many different fund raising events across the Benefice and whilst such events are primarily aimed at raising much needed funds for the various churches they are also opportunities for building up relationships.

Of course it's not just at such events where relationships are nurtured. On the last day of term I was privileged to attend the 'leaver's assembly' at Aldbrough Primary School. The year 6 pupils, many of whom had been together since they were 3 years old, were leaving one set of relationships behind and looking forward to starting new ones in September at their Secondary schools. There were plenty of photos of these young people when they were younger, and memories of events and people that had played a significant part of their time at Primary School. It reminded me that whilst in some ways this was a sad time, it was an essential part of growing up and travelling through life.

One of my favourite hymns is 'Guide me, O thou great Redeemer' - the words are inspirational despite the fact that we sing it in an English translation! Written around the middle of the 18<sup>th</sup> century it is one of many hymns that have become real treasures. It is a reminder that we are pilgrims in this earthly life - we are travelling through and this journey can only take us forward.

It's true that life is a journey beginning at our birth and ending when we die. Whilst probably everyone recognises this fact, I wonder whether being a Christian might make us think differently. In the Early Church the teaching of the Christian faith was based around the learning and receiving of key texts

### Marking the Centenary of the First World War

2014 is the one hundredth anniversary of the beginning of the First World War. Over 16 million people died in the conflict (of which 6 million were civilians), and 20 million wounded. The beginning of the War will be marked on Monday 4th August, with services at Westminster Abbey, Glasgow Cathedral, and St Symphorien Mons Cemetery.

On Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> August at 3.00pm in Aldbrough Church there will be a short service of commemoration followed by a procession to the War Memorial to dedicate a new plaque in remembrance of those who died in the conflict and to pray for peace. Single pink or white flowers or sprigs of rosemary will be laid at the foot of the memorial - please feel free to bring some with you,

such as the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments. It is sad that in many ways this teaching has been lost and so the Church of England has developed a new course of study called 'Pilgrim'. A pilgrim is of course a person on a journey - the Bible is full of such people: Abraham, Moses and Jesus to name a few. To be a pilgrim means that you have to follow certain paths with short breaks in between and this course has been devised with that in mind. The course begins with the 'Follow stage', consisting of four six week sessions exploring what it might mean to 'turn to Christ'; The Lord's Prayer; The Commandments and The Beatitudes.

Apparently we now have more digital conversations than real ones! A professor at the Institute of technology on Massachusetts asked people why this was - the basic response was along the lines of the fact that in real time you can't control what you are going to say, whereas with the digital conversation you were much more in control! This may be true but it is difficult to develop a true relationship with a digital device! We need to be in relationship with each other and with God if we are to grow in our Christian faith. So like many in the Diocese of York we shall be running the Pilgrim course in September and I hope that many of you, whether new to the faith or who want to develop their faith further, will consider this. There will be more details next month but if you'd like to know more then please speak to me.

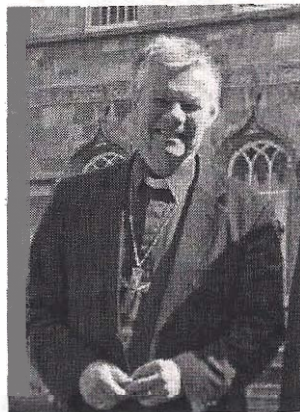

## NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE OF YORK

The Queen has approved the nomination of the Right Reverend Richard Michael Cokayne Frith, MA, Bishop of Hull, for election as the 105th Bishop of Hereford, in succession to the Right Reverend Anthony Martin Priddis, MA, whose resignation took effect on 24 September 2013.



The Rt Revd Richard Frith said, "It's a great privilege to become the Bishop of Hereford, but I'm going to miss Hull and the East Riding more than I can say. I've been very proud to be Bishop of such a vibrant, openhearted city. In the time I've been here I've seen amazing things happen in the city, culminating in Hull becoming the City of Culture for 2017. There have been massive developments in many aspects of the city, not least in education.

"The churches in Hull and the East Riding are wonderful, and it has been a privilege to work with them for the past sixteen years. These churches are at the heart of their communities, and do their best to serve them in all sorts of ways. I have loved working with them as they bear witness to the good news of Jesus Christ.

"I have worked with an enormous number of terrific people, both within and outside the church. There have been difficult, challenging times, but also much friendship and laughter. But now it's time for me to move on, with deep thankfulness for all that I have received from the people of Hull and the East
