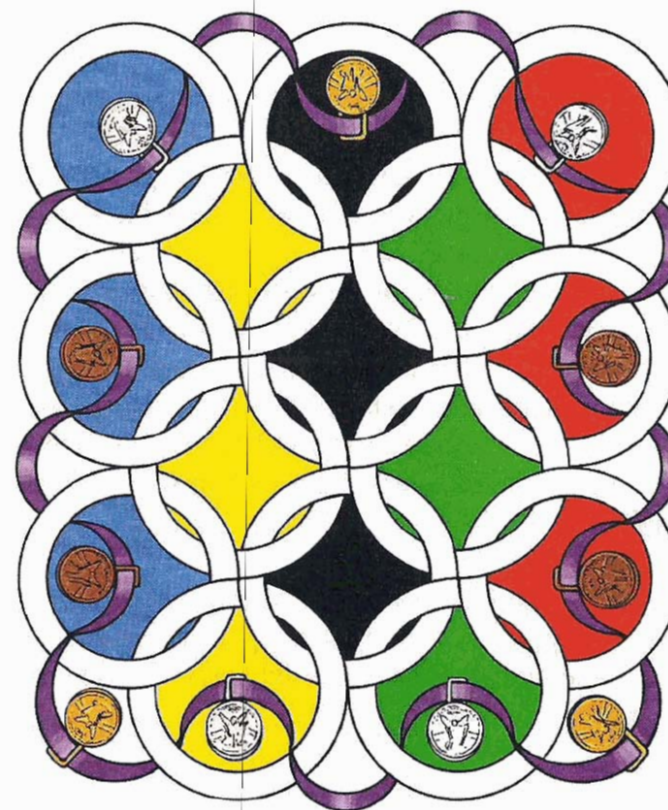

This month sees the start of the Rio de Janeiro Olympics, but 80 years ago the Berlin Olympics took place in the heart of Nazi Germany. Hitler, who had not been in power when the Games were awarded to Berlin in 1931, aimed to use the event to demonstrate Germany's alleged racial superiority, but the key athletics sprint events were won by the black American Jesse Owens!

Whether we are a great lover of sport or not we rejoice in the talents of so many people as we wait to see our heroes perhaps take gold again. Of course would say that the taking part is the most important as this story tells:

During the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, the British athlete Derek Redmond was running in the semi-finals of the 400 metres. About 250 metres from the finish his hamstring tore. He fell to the ground in pain and stretcher-bearers came over to him. However, Redmond wanted to finish the race and so he started hopping toward the finishing line. Suddenly Jim Redmond, Derek's father, ran out of the stands towards him. 'You don't have to do this,' he told his son. 'Yes, I do,' said Derek, to which his father said, 'We're going to finish this together.' They completed the lap with Derek leaning on his father's shoulder. As they crossed the finish line, the spectators rose to give Derek a standing ovation. Although he didn't win an Olympic medal, Derek Redmond finished the race with his father at his side.

St Paul in his letter to the Hebrews says that we too must run the race that is set before us, always looking to Jesus the 'pioneer and perfecter' of our faith. During this traditional 'holiday' period I pray that we will all have time to find our heavenly Father at our side.

St Alban's Church, Withernwick receives £99,500

St Alban's Church in Withernwick will benefit from £99,500 to address urgent roof repairs.

St Alban's PCC successfully applied for the grant through the Government-funded Listed Places of Worship: Roof Repair Fund. The present roof of St Alban's Church was constructed as part of the rebuild of the church in the 1850's. It is now in a very poor state and having a detrimental effect upon the interior. Parishioners have been working extremely hard to raise funds for the repair of the roof themselves. However, it was clear that to raise in excess of the £100,000 needed to effect a repair was going to be a challenge for this small but enthusiastic community. So an application was made to the Government-funded Listed Places of Worship: Roof Repair Fund. The opportune and exciting announcement of this successful application means that the PCC are now in a position to address the urgent repairs. The PCC and parishioners are thrilled to have received this grant. We believe that it marks the beginning of the realisation of a long-term vision within the village of Withernwick to develop the church as a community resource for many different groups.

This money is part of a wider funding package of £22.9million to 401 historic places of worship across the UK. The fund was launched by the Chancellor in his Autumn Statement in December 2014 and the funding package has now seen a total of 903 places of worship across the UK receive a share of £55million.

The Fund is administered by the National Heritage Memorial Fund (NHMF) on behalf of the Department for Culture Media and Sport (DCMS).

 We now have the guillemots & razorbills and their chicks, at 15 days old they are jumping off the cliffs in to the sea. They go with the male bird, he has to feed them on the sea for 6 weeks. Even though they cannot fly, they can still dive, and the numbers are going up each year. Also the puffin, their young will soon be leaving, soon they will be completely on their own. They leave at dusk like the others, safe from predators who will make a meal out of them. So then we will be left with the kittiwakes and chicks for a few more weeks, then just the 12000 pairs of Gannets, which will feed their chicks for 90 days, its gets larger than their parents & when it goes into the sea it cant fly so it cant feed as its far too heavy to fly. It will lose weight in about ten days, then its away on its own, even the parent birds don't bother with it once it leaves the nest, its the same with the kittiwakes chicks.
