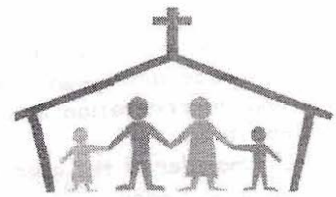

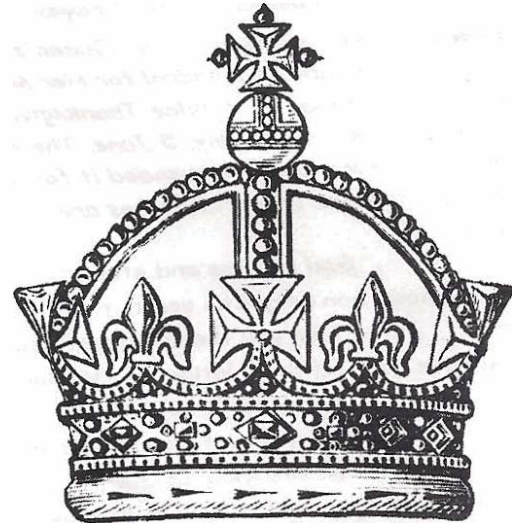

AMY'S OLYMPIC GOLD CHALLENGE

Amy Sherman from The Falcon Inn, Withernwick was chosen to represent the Charity Scope to take part in an event at the Olympic Stadium on Sunday 1st April, 2012. This was a Charity Day to reward individuals and groups taking part in the Gold Challenge (which is an event whereby groups and individuals raise money for Charity through sporting challenges). This was one of the first events to be held in the new Olympic stadium.

Amy's school, South Holderness Technology College, are supporting Amy in this and they are holding several fund raising events within the school. During the day there were several events in the stadium involving some members of the Team GB and other celebrities and a parade on the Olympic track. Amy had 3 tickets to take part in this parade (plus ones for her parents, John & Julie) - 1 ticket for her and the other 2 for the school - 1 teacher and 1 other pupil. A coach full of pupils and teachers from South Holderness College went to London to support Amy, together with members of Amy's family.

From the main charities (Scope being one of them) each were allowed to run an event/race on the actual 100m track to be used at the Olympics. Amy was chosen to compete in this and had some training from an Olympic athlete before taking part in the event.

During the day Amy took part in the Charity parade and race and was followed by a Chinese film crew reporting for China Central Television who had become interested in Amy's story and who recorded all the days events and interviewed Amy and her parents for a programme to be shown in China.

It was a fantastic day and one Amy and her family will never forget, especially when they could hear her school friends chanting her name from the stands as she walked onto the track and encouraged her in the race

A sweepstake was run at The Falcon to raise money for Scope and to guess how long it would take Amy to complete the 100m. Amy completed the race in 29.4 seconds and the prize of a TV was won by Pat Beddard of Withernwick. The sweepstake raised a total of £435.00 for Scope.

Amy and her family would like to thank everyone who encouraged and supported her and especially for helping to raise further funds for Scope.

News from John Witty: I have been a member of RSPB for 30 years now and a volunteer for 11 years. I have been interested in wild life since I was 15 years old, The same pair of gannets have laid their eggs every year. They will sit on the egg for 44 days till it hatches and feed it for about 90 days till old to look after itself The other day I saw a pair of red kites down Whitedale Road. How to tell them: they have a long forked tail and a reddish-brown body with fingered wing tips. Also I know where a pair of barn owls are - pleased to say they are using an owl box put up for them by a farmer, as a lot of the old buildings have been knocked down and I have a friend working for Yorkshire wild trust at Spurn Point this year, helping with little tern They make a nest by scraping in shingle and lay 1-3 eggs, incubated for 18-22 days. To close with I went to Joan Gibson on her 90 birthday at the Elms Nursing Home in Sutton. Joan was pleased to see us all and looks really well so I am going to see Joan again soon.
